

## What are some names of the Holy Spirit?

### 1. Circle the names used in the Old Testament that identify the Holy Spirit:

The earth was formless and void, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was moving over the surface of the waters. (Gen 1:2, NASB)

When the sons of Israel cried to the Lord, the Lord raised up a deliverer for the sons of Israel to deliver them, Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother. The Spirit of the Lord came upon him, and he judged Israel. When he went out to war, the Lord gave Cushan-rishathaim king of Mesopotamia into his hand, so that he prevailed over Cushan-rishathaim. (Jud 3:9-10, NASB)

The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me,  
Because the Lord has anointed me  
To bring good news to the afflicted;  
He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted,  
To proclaim liberty to captives  
And freedom to prisoners; (Isa 61:1, NASB)

### 2. Circle the names used by Jesus that identify the Holy Spirit:

For it is not you who speak, but it is the Spirit of your Father who speaks in you. (Matt 10:20, NASB)

And behold, I am sending forth the promise of My Father upon you; but you are to stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high. (Luke 24:49, NASB)

### 3. Circle the names used by the apostles that identify the Holy Spirit:

When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; and the eunuch no longer saw him, but went on his way rejoicing. (Acts 8:39, NASB)

But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you. (Rom 8:11, NASB)

Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God. (1 Cor 6:11, NASB)

You are our letter, written in our hearts, known and read by all men; being manifested that you are a letter of Christ, cared for by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. (2 Cor 3:2-3, NASB)

Because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" (Gal 4:6, NASB)

What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed; and in this I rejoice. Yes, and I will rejoice, for I know that this will turn out for my deliverance through your prayers and the provision of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, according to my earnest expectation and hope, that I will not be put to shame in anything, but that with all boldness, Christ will even now, as always, be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. (Phil 1:18-20, NASB)

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Teacher Notes**

This lesson introduces the concept of the triune nature of God by showing the student the various names used for the Holy Spirit that associates Him with God the Father and His Son Jesus Christ.

Read the various passages out loud as the student follows the print and help the student observe the different names of the Holy Spirit.

1. Circle the names used in the Old Testament that identify the Holy Spirit:

The earth was formless and void, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the **Spirit of God** was moving over the surface of the waters. (Gen 1:2, NASB)

The Spirit of God. Note that the Holy Spirit was involved with Creation.

When the sons of Israel cried to the Lord, the Lord raised up a deliverer for the sons of Israel to deliver them, Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother. The **Spirit of the Lord** came upon him, and he judged Israel. When he went out to war, the Lord gave Cushan-rishathaim king of Mesopotamia into his hand, so that he prevailed over Cushan-rishathaim. (Jud 3:9-10, NASB)

The Spirit of the Lord. Note that the Holy Spirit came upon leaders of the nation of Israel.

The **Spirit of the Lord God** is upon me,  
Because the Lord has anointed me  
To bring good news to the afflicted;  
He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted,  
To proclaim liberty to captives  
And freedom to prisoners; (Isa 61:1, NASB)

The Spirit of the Lord God. Note that the Holy Spirit came upon the prophets of God.

2. Circle the names used by Jesus that identify the Holy Spirit:

For it is not you who speak, but it is the **Spirit of your Father** who speaks in you. (Matt 10:20, NASB)

The Spirit of your Father.

If the student is capable, then this side point may be considered. In this instance, Jesus is speaking with the future in view after He has died and resurrected. Note that the Holy Spirit is in the Believer, which contrasts the Old Testament where the Holy Spirit can come upon and leave a Believer.

And behold, I am sending forth **the promise of My Father** upon you; but you are to stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high. (Luke 24:49, NASB)

The Promise of My Father.

If the student is capable, this side point may be considered. This promise was made in the New Covenant.

3. Circle the names used by the apostles that identify the Holy Spirit:

When they came up out of the water, the **Spirit of the Lord** snatched Philip away; and the eunuch no longer saw him, but went on his way rejoicing. (Acts 8:39, NASB)

The Spirit of the Lord.

But if the **Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead** dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you. (Rom 8:11, NASB)

The Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead.

Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the **Spirit of our God**. (1 Cor 6:11, NASB)

The Spirit of our God.

You are our letter, written in our hearts, known and read by all men; being manifested that you are a letter of Christ, cared for by us, written not with ink but with the **Spirit of the living God**, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. (2 Cor 3:2-3, NASB)

The Spirit of the Living God.

Because you are sons, God has sent forth the **Spirit of His Son** into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" (Gal 4:6, NASB)

The Spirit of His Son.

What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed; and in this I rejoice. Yes, and I will rejoice, for I know that this will turn out for my deliverance through your prayers and the provision of the **Spirit of Jesus Christ**, according to my earnest expectation and hope, that I will not be put to shame in anything, but that with all boldness, Christ will even now, as always, be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. (Phil 1:18-20, NASB)

The Spirit of Jesus Christ.

Help the student review the various names of the Holy Spirit and see that they are associated with God the Father and God the Son. This special relationship shows that the Holy Spirit is distinguishable from yet in unison with God and Jesus Christ.

This is just the beginning of understanding that God is one Divine Being who has three distinguishable personal distinctions; each serves the other in selfless love and working dependently and cooperatively together.

God is not three distinct individuals working independently.

God does not have three phases as solid, liquid, and gas.

God does not act in three different ways.
