1. On what day was Woman created?

Sorry, that is incorrect. Whoops! There's no biblical reference for this perspective.

b. Day 6.

Correct! The answer is "b"!

Woman was created on the 6th day, the same day Adam was created, but at some period after Adam's creation.

c. Day 7

Sorry, that is incorrect. God rested on the seventh day.

"By the seventh day God completed His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made." (Gen 2:2-3)

d. Day 8.

Sorry, that is incorrect. There is no significance for the eighth day in the Bible.

2. What was the primary reason why Woman was created?

a. To keep Adam company.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This is true; however, there is another answer that is correct as well!

"Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good for the man to be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him.'" (Gen 2:18)

b. To cultivate and protect the Garden of Eden.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The Bible does not mention this function for Woman.

c. To nurture Man.

Sorry, that is incorrect. While nurturing is an important component in a relationship between a man and woman, God created Woman for a different primary function.

d. No suitable helper could be found among the beasts of the field and birds of the sky.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This is true; however, there is another correct answer in this list of options.

e. Both a and d.

Correct! The answer is "e"!

"Then the LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him." Out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the sky, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called a living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all the cattle, and to the birds of the sky, and to every beast of the field, but for Adam there was not found a helper suitable for him. So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then He took one of his ribs and closed up the flesh at that place. The LORD God fashioned into a woman the rib which He had taken from the man, and brought her to the man." (Gen 2:18-21)

3. How did Woman get her name?

Correct! The answer is "a"!

The man said, "This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man." (Gen 2:23)

Sorry, that is incorrect.

"The man said, 'This is now bone of my bones, And flesh of my flesh; She shall be called Woman, Because she was taken out of Man." (Gen 2:23)

c. She chose her name.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Woman did not name herself Woman or chose any other name.

"Now the man called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all the living." (Gen 3:20)

d. From legendary sources.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This option ignores explicit information in the Bible.

4. Who initiates the formation of a new household?

a. God.

Sorry, that is incorrect. While God provides the basis for a man to leave his father and mother, the act of initiating a new household is not by God.

"And He answered and said, 'Have you not read that He who created them from the beginning made them male and female, and said, 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh'? So they are no longer two, but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let no man separate." (Matt 19:4-6)

b. Woman.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The Bible does not provide any justification for this.

"For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother, and be joined to his wife; and they shall become one flesh." (Gen 2:24)

c. Man.

Correct! The answer is "c"!

For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother, and be joined to his wife; and they shall become one flesh. (Gen 2:24)

d. Tradition.

Sorry, that is incorrect. There is no biblical indication for this.
