1. What were the sin(s) that God judged for?

a. Woman was judged for listening to the serpent and eating the fruit.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This is true; however, there is more than 1 correct answer for this question!

"To the woman He said, 'I will greatly multiply Your pain in childbirth, In pain you will bring forth children; Yet your desire will be for your husband, And he will rule over you." (Gen 3:16)

b. Adam was judged for listening to the voice of his wife and eating the fruit.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This is the answer most people should get; however, there is more than 1 correct answer for this question!

"Then to Adam He said, 'Because you have listened to the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree about which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat from it'; Cursed is the ground because of you; In toil you will eat of it All the days of your life. Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you; And you will eat the plants of the field; By the sweat of your face You will eat bread, Till you return to the ground, Because from it you were taken; For you are dust, And to dust you shall return." (Gen 3:17-19)

c. Adam and Woman were judged for not obeying God.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This is absolutely true; however, "a" and "b" are true as well. The correct answer is "d"!

d. All of the above.

Correct! The answer is "d"!

All of the above.

2. What was the consequence of eating from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil?

a. Human beings lost the beauty of innocence.

Correct! Adam and Eve lost their innocence.

"Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loin coverings. They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. Then the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?' He said, 'I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself.' And He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?'" (Gen 3:7-11) b. Human beings hate snakes.

Sorry, that is incorrect. While people may hate snakes, there is no mention that Adam and Eve developed that fear.

c. Adam and Woman admitted their guilt.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Adam did not take responsibility for his decision; he blamed Woman.

"And He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?' The man said, 'The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me from the tree, and I ate.'" (Gen 3:11-12)

Woman did not take responsibility for her decision; she blamed the serpent.

"Then the Lord God said to the woman, 'What is this you have done?' And the woman said, 'The serpent deceived me, and I ate." (Gen 3:13)

d. All of the above.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Because "b" and "c" are incorrect, "d" is incorrect.

3. Who changed Woman's name to Eve?

a. God.

Sorry, that is incorrect. God did not change Woman's name to Eve.

b. Adam.

Correct! The answer is "b"!

Adam changed Woman's name to Eve.

"Now the man called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all the living." (Gen 3:20)

c. Woman.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Woman did not change her name.

d. Serpent.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The serpent did not change her name.
