What divine attributes does the Holy Spirit have?

There are instances where God and Jesus are portrayed as one and the same as seen in this example in Revelation:

In John's opening statement to the seven churches, God introduces Himself as the eternal Being – the Alpha and the Omega.

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." (Rev 1:8, NKJV)

In the new Jerusalem, where the throne of God is identified as "the throne of God and of the Lamb" (Rev 22:3), Jesus Christ identifies Himself with the same title as that of His Father.

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End, the First and the Last." (Rev 22:13, NKJV)

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The Holy Spirit is referred to with a personal pronoun distinguishable from God and Jesus Christ.

The Holy Spirit is under the direction of God.

The Holy Spirit is a distinct personality with power: He helps and eternally abides within the Believer.

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The divine attribute is all powerful or omnipotence. God, His Son, and His Spirit were all involved with Creation and the creation of man.

The divine attribute is omniscience. As God and His Son knows all things, Isaiah teaches that no one can teach the Holy Spirit, because the Spirit already knows everything, and Paul teaches that the Holy Spirit knows all of what God knows.

The divine attribute is eternal. Just as God is timeless and existed without a beginning, Jesus Christ is without a beginning or end, and the Holy Spirit is described as eternal.

The divine attribute is truth. All three personalities of the Trinity factually truly exist and in accordance to reality. The historical existence of all three and what they say about the life and soul of a human being are fundamental realities of life

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The divine attribute is knowing each and every person by searching our hearts and mind.

The divine attribute is sanctifying, setting apart, each Believer for God. When God commands Believers, "be holy for I am holy" (1 Pet 1:16), He is speaking of abiding to His commands and moral code, which would distinguish Believers as "My treasured possession, a kingdom of priests, and my holy nation" (Ex 19:5-6). God sanctifies by instructing how to be holy, Jesus Christ sanctifies by providing the means of atonement of sins, and the Holy Spirit sanctifies by indwelling, helps the Believer understand the Bible and provides the power to resist the temptation of sin.

3. From the above data, what do you conclude about the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit has divine qualities that are like and equivalent to God and Jesus Christ. This evidence supports the concept of the Trinity, because if they were not the same, they would not share the same characteristics. They are God, because there is only one God.

Upon closer examination, the uniqueness of the Trinity is found in their service of selfless love towards each other. The Father serves the Son, the Son serves the Father, and both defer to the Holy Spirit who also defers and serves the Father and the Son. This concept is what makes Christianity unique, a model for Christian living, and is beyond human nature and comprehension.
