What do Evil Angels Do?

As you read or listen to these biblical passages, what is the real objective of evil angels? How do they harm us?

1. What do Satan and his demons do to non-Believers? How do they work on non-Believers? What clues do you observe with the apostle Paul's confrontation of Elymas?

But Elymas the sorcerer (that is the meaning of his name) opposed them and tried to turn the proconsul away from the faith.

But Saul—also called Paul—filled with the Holy Spirit, stared straight at Elymas and said, "You are full of all kinds of deceit and trickery, you son of the devil and enemy of all that is right. Won't you ever stop perverting the straight paths of the Lord? (Acts 13:8-10, CSB)

2. Observe what the apostle Paul is warning the Believers of the church of Corinth. What disguises does Satan and his demons put on? What are they trying to do?

For such people are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. And no wonder! For Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. So it is no great surprise if his servants also disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Their end will be according to their works. (2 Cor 11:12-15, CSB)

3. Moses foretells what happens when Believers have a weak faith in God. What can Satan and his demons do?

They provoked His jealousy with different gods; they enraged him with detestable practices.

They sacrificed to demons, not God, to gods they had not known, new gods that had just arrived, which your ancestors did not fear. (Deut 32:16-17, CSB)

But sexual immorality and any impurity or greed should not even be heard of among you, as is proper for saints. Obscene and foolish talking or crude joking are not suitable, but rather giving thanks. For know and recognize this: Every sexually immoral or impure or greedy person, who is an idolater, does not have an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.

Let no one deceive you with empty arguments, for God's wrath is coming on the disobedient because of these things. (Eph 5:3-6, CSB)

Teacher Notes

Ask the student: does Elymas believe in Jesus Christ?

Elymas, a non-Believer under the influence of Satan, sought to deceive the government official about the truth of Jesus Christ and the gospel. An example of deceiving someone about the truth is to convince someone that Jesus Christ is not the Son of God.

2. Observe what the apostle Paul is warning the Believers of the church of Corinth. What disguises does Satan and his demons put on? What are they trying to do?

But I will continue to do what I am doing, in order to deny an opportunity to those who want to be regarded as our equals in what they boast about. For such people are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. And no wonder! For Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. So it is no great surprise if his servants also disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Their end will be according to their works. (2 Cor 11:12-15, CSB)

Ask the student: did you notice that Satan and his demons put on two main disguises?

Satan disguises himself as a good angel, and his demons disguise themselves as false Christians.

Ask the student: can you tell who is a false Christian?

It's difficult and never certain. Deceitful people can tell you anything to gain your trust. It takes time to evaluate someone's behavior to see if they line up with God's word. Only God knows who is a genuine Believer.

3. Moses foretells what happens when Believers have a weak faith in God. What can Satan and his demons do?

They provoked His jealousy with different gods;

they enraged him with detestable practices.

They sacrificed to demons, not God,

to gods they had not known,

new gods that had just arrived,

which your ancestors did not fear. (Deut 32:16-17, CSB)

Ask the student: what does it mean to sacrifice to demons?

Satan and his demons try to get you to worship them through other religions or things like money or power.

4. The apostle Paul warns Believers what happens when Believers have a weak faith in God. What can Satan and his demons do?

But sexual immorality and any impurity or greed should not even be heard of among you, as is proper for saints. Obscene and foolish talking or crude joking are not suitable, but rather giving thanks. For know and recognize this: Every sexually immoral or impure or greedy person, who is an idolater, does not have an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.

Let no one deceive you with empty arguments, for God's wrath is coming on the disobedient because of these things. (Eph 5:3-6, CSB)

Inform the student: when Christians don't know God or His word, the Bible, they continue to behave sinfully by being immoral or greedy.

When you don't know God's word, Satan and his demons take advantage by deceiving you so that you think it's OK to be immoral or greedy. You end up disobeying God and His word and failing His standard of being holy as He is holy.

5. What can you do to protect yourself?

Read this biblical passage to the student:

Finally, be strengthened by the Lord and by his vast strength. Put on the full armor of God so that you can stand against the schemes of the devil. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this darkness, against evil, spiritual forces in the heavens. For this reason take up the full armor of God, so that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and having prepared everything, to take your stand. Stand, therefore, with truth like a belt around your waist, righteousness like armor on your chest, and your feet sandaled with readiness for the gospel of peace. In every situation take up the shield of faith with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit—which is the word of God. (Eph 5:10-17, CSB)

Faith is all about knowing God and placing a trust in His word. The strength of your shield depends on the strength of your faith in God.

Salvation is knowing that Jesus died for your sins and learning to desire what Jesus desires frees you from the power of sinful desires. This increases the strength of your helmet.

How well you know the Bible and live by it, strengthens the sword of the Spirit, which enables you to resist Satan and his demons.
