1. What does the term "fallen" angel refer to?

- a. Angels that no longer have an abode in heaven.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This answer is partially correct but is not the complete answer; there are two other correct answers as well!

- b. Evil and unclean spirits.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This answer is partially correct but is not the complete answer; there are two other correct answers as well!

- c. Principalities and powers.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This answer is partially correct but is not the complete answer; there are two other correct answers as well!

- d. All of the above.

Correct! The answer is "d"! All of the above. These angels no longer reside in heaven, because they are morally evil which makes them unholy and unclean. From an earthly perspective, they are also known as "principalities" and "powers."

2. Every single New Testament author writes of fallen angels.

- a. True.

Correct! The answer is "a"! True! Every New Testament author writes of fallen angels!

b. False.

Sorry, that is incorrect. When you check each book of the New Testament, you'll discover some mention about Satan, demons, unclean spirits, evil spirits, and principalities and powers!

3. Where do the free fallen angels roam?

a. First heaven.

Correct! The answer is "a"! As a consequence of their rebellion, Satan and his followers were removed from their dwelling in God's presence (third heaven) to reside within the atmosphere of earth (first heaven) after Jesus Christ was born (Rev 12:7-10).

b. Second heaven.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The Bible indicates that second heaven describes the universe including the sun, moon and stars.

c. Third heaven.

Sorry, that is incorrect. While the Bible does not reveal much, third heaven is understood to be where God resides.

d. Both second and third heaven.

Sorry, that is incorrect. If you answered "b" or "c," you would realize that "d" is incorrect!

4. Where do the confined fallen angels reside?

a. Tartaros.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Found in 2 Peter 2:4-5, the Greek hapax legomena "tartaros" means "hell." So there are more than one correct answer among these options!

b. Hell.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Hell is correct but there are two other correct answers as well; thus, "d" is the truly correct answer.

c. Abusso.

Sorry, that is incorrect. "Abusso" is used nine times in the New Testament, and in most cases, appears to refer to "tartarosas," a deep gloomy pit that confines fallen angels. So there is more than one correct answer to this question!

d. All of the above.

Correct! The answer is "d"! It appears that confined fallen angels are held in hell temporarily, which is also known in Greek as *tartarosas* and *abusso*, until final judgment and ultimate consignment to the eternal lake of fire.

5. What was Satan's sin that caused him to be cast down from heaven?

a. The temptation of Eve.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Because Satan was created on the first day of Creation and was present to in the Garden of Eden, the anointed cherub apparently was cast down from covering God's glory sometime before the temptation of Eve.

b. Pride in his beauty.

Correct! The answer is "b"!

Your heart was lifted up because of your beauty; You corrupted your wisdom by reason of your splendor I cast you to the ground... (Ezek 28:17, NASB)

c. The temptation of Jesus.

Sorry, that is incorrect. By the time of the New Testament, Satan had already lost his position as anointed cherub and thrown out.

d. Pride in his status as God's anointed cherub.

Sorry, that is incorrect. While Satan was God's anointed cherub, there is no mention that Satan's sin included pride in his heavenly position.

6. What does the Greek term "diabolos" mean?

a. Murderer.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The Greek term "diabolos" does not mean "murderer."

b. Evil one.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The Greek term "diabolos" does not mean "evil one."

c. False accuser.

Correct! The answer is "c"! The Greek term means "false accuser." Bolstering his function as an accuser, Satan is associated with the *certificate of debt* which is believed to be a record of one's sins presented at the time of Judgment for the purpose of indicting human beings.

d. Ruler of this world.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The Greek term "diabolos" does not mean "ruler of this world."

7. What does the Hebrew term **sātān** mean?

a. Beelzebul.

Sorry, that is incorrect. While Satan's personal name is derived from the Hebrew term "sātān," it does not mean "Beelzebul"

b. Adversary.

Correct! The answer is "b"! The Hebrew term means "adversary." It is an opponent who hinders another. An adversary of God, Satan opposes and hinders God's plan of salvation and redemption and the re-establishment of His kingdom on earth. As an adversary to Christians, Satan deceives human beings so that he can use them to establish his kingdom on earth.

c. Serpent.

Sorry, that is incorrect. The Hebrew term "sātān" does not mean "serpent."

d. Father of lies.

Sorry, that is incorrect. This option sounds good; however, the Hebrew term "sātān" does not mean "father of lies."

8. When was Satan created?

a. Day 1 of Creation.

Correct! The answer is "a"! Satan was created on the first day of Creation, but fell from heaven sometime before the temptation of Eve.

b. Day 3 of Creation.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Satan was created before this.

c. Day 6 of Creation.

Sorry, that is incorrect. Satan was created on the first day of Creation.

d. Sometime after the first 6 days of Creation.

Sorry, that is incorrect. All angels were created on the first day of Creation.
