What does it mean?

God is salvation. Take a moment to discuss the implications of the true meaning of Jesus’ name.

“Therefore say to the house of Israel, ‘Thus says Lord Yahweh, **“It is not for your sake, O house of Israel, that I am about to act, but for My holy name, which you have profaned among the nations, to which you have come. I will prove the holiness of My great name which has been profaned among the nations, which you have profaned in their midst. Then the nations will know that I am Yahweh,”** declares Lord Yahweh, “when I prove Myself holy among you in their sight. And I will take you from the nations, gather you from all the lands, and bring you into your own land. Then I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your uncleanness and from all your idols. Moreover, I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; and I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. (Ezek 36:22-26 [New Covenant], LSB)

For the Scripture says, **“Whoever believes upon Him will not be put to shame.”** For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord is Lord of all, abounding in riches for all who call on Him, for **“Whoever calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”** (Rom 10:11-13, LSB)
